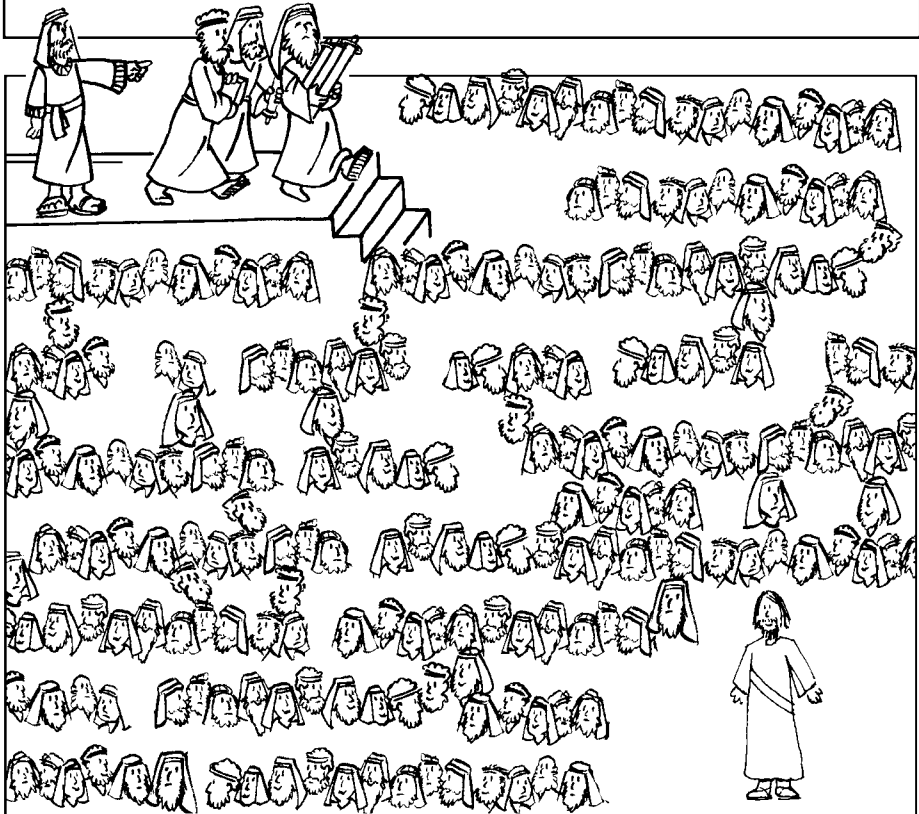

Paying Taxes to Caesar

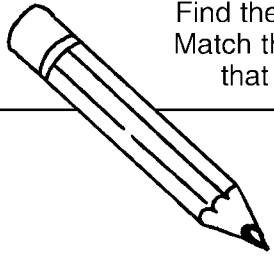
The Pharisees made plans to trap Jesus with His own words. They sent their students to Him, along with some of Herod's people.

Help them find their way through the crowd to Jesus.

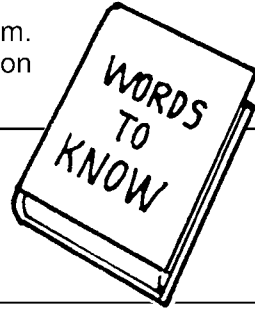
