In addition to its use during Eastertide, white is also seen on the Sundays of Christmas, Epiphany of Our Lord, Baptism of Our Lord, Transfiguration Sunday and Holy Trinity Sunday.

Also, the Saturday meeting will be by ZOOM only in order to facilitate participation by those members who have mobility limits or who prefer to avoid indoor crowds at this time. If you wish to participate in the ZOOM meeting, then be sure that you have the ZOOM app installed on a computer or smart phone, preferably one with a video camera and microphone. All three town halls will be open to questions and comments about BSLC and where we are heading as a congregation. There will not be different agendas for each one. So, you may select whichever time and date is most convenient for you to participate.
